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Trade Facilitation and Needs Assessment

From Macedonia's perspective:

- The TFA provides assurance to landlocked countries with respect to transit.
- Will positively affect Macedonia's ability to attract foreign investments.
- Will foster an improved environment for participation of Macedonian companies in international value chains.

#### Self Assessment Process

- To help Macedonia better understand the WTO Trade Facilitation Agreement.
- Determine overall compliance level
- To help Macedonia determine the areas where implementation may present challenges and require greater attention and resources.
- To foster a national dialogue among the stakeholders on trade facilitation.





Level of Compliance with Measures






#### Self Assessment Overview of Findings

    - Currently such processing is not available but will be implemented along with the new customs declaration processing system in 2015.

#### Conclusions

- Enquiry Point for Trade Facilitation will be established by the Customs Administration
- National Committee for Trade Facilitation will be established by Ministry of Economy with participation of all relevant agencies



#### Recommendations

- Continue with implementation of the system for integrated risk analysis by Customs and other relevant border agencies.
- Donors are encouraged to provide necessary training in those areas identified in the selfassessment: training for transit coordinators, with respect to RIA assessments, and enquiry points.
- Assistance is needed for implementation of WTO Time release study.
