<ul> <li>Action objective: To facilitate trade in the CEFTA region through the reduction and eventual removal of the most distortive non-tariff measures to trade for two selected supply chains, and through the simplification of trade related procedures</li> <li>Duration: 2017-2020 (36 months) Budget: EUR 3,05 mln.</li> <li>Beneficiaries: CEFTA Committee of Trade Facilitation, ministries responsible for trade and agriculture, customs administrations, technical agencies and private sector across the CEFTA region</li> <li>Approach: The Action takes a product oriented approach (focusing on two selected supply chains) and examines the three main dimensions that affect free trade of goods in the CEFTA region:</li> <li>→ Non-Tariff Measures stemming from non-harmonized legislation and practices</li> <li>→ Redundant and overlapping document and data submission requirements for traders</li> <li>→ Excessive and redundant physical inspections at the border.</li> <li>Impact on CEFTA:</li> <li>Reduction of clearance time required for selected supply chains (days)</li> <li>Reduction of number of documents/information required for selected supply chains.</li> <li>Reduction of frequency in physical controls for selected supply chains.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Component 0 - Horizontal support and private sector involvement</li> <li>Awareness raising within the private and public sectors on how to best address non-tariff measures impacting business competitiveness in the region</li> <li>Establish effective communication channels with business by launching Regional Business Advisory Groups for two selected supply chains (RBAGs)</li> <li>Strengthening public-private dialogue for trade facilitation in CEFTA</li> <li>Component 1 - Harmonization of norms and Practices</li> <li>Analyse trade related legislation and practices in all clearance stages against the EU Acquis and international rules</li> <li>Identify measures that are in contradiction and provide a set of country-specific recommendations</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Component 2 - Streamlining of document and data submission requirements</li> <li>Systematic mapping of documents and data required by each of the CEFTA Parties for selected supply chains</li> <li>Cross-checking between the Parties and benchmarking with EU and international standards</li> <li>Identify redundancies and overlaps in data submission requirements with and provision of assistance for streamlining the documentary requirements</li> <li>Component 3 - Simplification of control clearance procedures</li> <li>Support the implementation of the mutually recognized CEFTA Authorised Economic Operator (AEO) Programme through regional piloting</li> <li>Support implementation of validation methods for mutual recognition of AEO in CEFTA</li> </ul>
