#### Trade and Development: Concept

- ▶ Trade openness a precondition for faster economic growth?
  - ▶ Two opposite effects for the domestic companies
    - ► Costs of exports decrease
    - ▶ The competition on the domestic markets increase
  - Competitiveness of the domestic industry determines the impact of trade liberalization
- ▶ Trade policies platforms:
  - ► Export orientation
  - ► Import substitution
  - Global value/supply chains




- ▶ High trade openness

  - Weak integration of CEFTA Parties into the global value/supply chains





#### Trade Policy Challenges in CEFTA Parties

- Identification of export-oriented industries that could boost economic growth in the country
- Setting mid-term strategy for shift from low-value to higher value added exports
- Strengthening the link between trade and other policies (industrial, education, labor market, research and development)
- Peer-learning instead of setting non-tariff barriers
- Perception of "CEFTA" concept primarily as a tool for development, not a competition among the countries
