Foreword

Organised under the theme Trading Together, Towards Europe, this year's edition of CEFTA Week focuses on the contribution of CEFTA to competitiveness, digital transformation, and gradual integration into the European Union. It will bring together decision-makers and experts to shape policy discussions on how trade cooperation and market integration under CEFTA can deliver tangible benefits for businesses and citizens while supporting alignment with the EU acquis.

During three days, participants will engage in discussions on CEFTA's evolving role in a changing trade environment, exploring pathways for gradual and functional EU integration and highlighting how CEFTA contributes to the implementation of the Common Regional Market 2025 to 2028 and the EU Growth Plan for the Western Balkans and for Moldova. The programme will feature the main conference on 3 December, complemented by meetings of CEFTA bodies and dedicated side events on 1 and 2 December. Through high-level discussions, technical panels, and exchanges with young people and the private sector, CEFTA Week 2025 will underline CEFTA's role as a framework for inclusive dialogue and evidence-based policymaking.

Underscoring the political and economic significance of CEFTA cooperation, the high-level dialogue will bring together ministers from CEFTA Parties for an exchange on shared priorities and the path towards deeper economic integration. The discussion will explore CEFTA's role in fostering economic resilience, competitiveness, and EU convergence in a period of global uncertainty.

The discussions will focus on policy areas where CEFTA plays a key role in translating commitments into practical measures. These include trade facilitation and customs modernisation, the development of digital and paperless trade systems, and the establishment of recognition frameworks that enable smoother movement of goods, services, and people, such as the recognition of professional qualifications, trusted operators, and electronic signatures. The programme will also highlight the potentials of enhanced cooperation in areas such as e-commerce, consumer protection, and digital innovation, and provide space to reflect on priorities for implementing the new Common Regional Market Action Plan for 2025 to 2028.

CEFTA Week 2025 represents an important moment to take stock of progress, share perspectives, and shape the future direction of trade cooperation within CEFTA. It also marks the conclusion of the CEFTA Chairmanship 2025 and the start of the Chairmanship for 2026, reaffirming the shared commitment of all CEFTA Parties to advance economic integration and to move together towards the EU.

9:30-10:45 CEFTA in a Changing World - What Future for Regional Trade Cooperation?

<u>Description:</u> Moderated high-level panel discussion dedicated to exploring the role of CEFTA and regional trade agreements in an era of heightened uncertainty and shifting trade patterns and alliances. The opening session will set the tone for CEFTA Week 2025 by addressing how regional trade agreements such as CEFTA contribute to economic resilience, competitiveness, and EU convergence at a time of global volatility. Participants will explore the strategic role of CEFTA within the Common Regional Market 2.0 and its alignment with the EU Growth Plan for the Western Balkans. The discussion will highlight key achievements in CEFTA's regional trade integration, emerging challenges from supply-chain disruptions, geopolitical tensions, and climate-driven trade policies, as well as CEFTA's contribution to building a predictable and rules-based trade environment grounded in EU standards.

11:00-12:15 Gradual and Functional EU Integration of CEFTA

<u>Description</u>: This moderated panel discussion will explore practical pathways for the CEFTA region's gradual and functional integration into the EU, focusing on how it can align with EU policies and benefit from "phased" integration even before full membership. The discussion will highlight strategies to deepen integration into the EU single market in incremental steps - for example, participating in select EU programs, adopting EU standards early, and cooperating in specific sectors - to bring tangible benefits sooner ("access before accession"). The panel will appeal to a broad policy audience by linking technical integration steps with the wider EU accession perspective, emphasizing the economic and political benefits of closer integration for citizens and businesses.

<u>Description:</u> An inspirational presentation exploring how artificial intelligence is reshaping trade and redefining the way trade systems operate and evolve. It will highlight AI's potential to optimise customs, streamline procedures, and support evidence-based policymaking for a more resilient and adaptive CEFTA market. 14:00-15:00 Make Trade Easier - Paperless, Faster, Recognised (A Practical Trade Facilitation Case Study)

<u>Description</u>: This technical panel will showcase a practical example of trading a specific good across CEFTA, highlighting how new trade facilitation measures (like electronic data exchange, "paperless" processing, and recognition of standards) can make trade faster and simpler. The title reflects the key aspects: moving away from burdensome paperwork through digital systems, speeding up procedures, and having certificates or authorizations recognised by different administrations. By walking through a realistic end-to-end trade scenario, the panel will illustrate the complexities businesses currently face and how initiatives like SEED+ (Systematic Exchange of Electronic Data) are helping overcome these hurdles. This concrete approach will appeal not only to technical experts but also to a broader policy audience by bringing abstract trade reforms to life in an accessible way.

15:15-15:45 Mini Debate: Achieving Single Market-Style Recognition by 2026

<u>Description</u>: A fast-paced Oxford-style mini debate focusing (for example) on whether CEFTA can reach a stage where at least three industrial sectors operate with recognition of standards or qualifications akin to the EU Single Market by 2026. One speaker will argue "Yes, it's achievable and underway," and another will argue "No, it's unlikely by 2026," providing a clash of perspectives.

15:45-16:30 Change through Synergy - Partners in Support of Reforms

<u>Description</u>: This panel brings together development partners ("minor donors" and regional institutions) to discuss how to implement needed policy and institutional changes in the region through better synergy and coordination. CEFTA will act as a framing actor, outlining the reform agenda (e.g. implementing trade agreements, regulatory alignment, capacity building) that requires support. The panel's aim is to identify ways multiple donors/programs can work in concert rather than in silos, ensuring that external assistance is aligned with priorities and that reforms are implemented effectively on the ground. The discussion will appeal to a broad policy audience by highlighting concrete examples of donor coordination improving outcomes (avoiding overlap, pooling resources) and by showing how international support translates into real-world change for the CEFTA's EU integration and economic development goals.
